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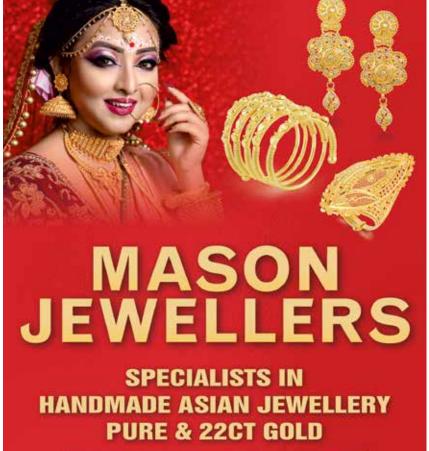
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Hitting £1MILLION!

Yorkshire's famous Ramadan Runner smashes fundraising milestone, and now set for his 12th annual charity run

Renowned award-winning community champion Nazim Ali aka Ramadan Runner, has achieved a remarkable, awe-inspiring £1 million milestone in charitable fundraising, marking a significant legacy of generosity and service.

This incredible feat follows his latest life-changing humanitarian deployment to Jordan ahead of Ramadan 2025, where he continued his mission to support the most vulnerable.

Now, his latest challenge is the return of his famous "Ramadan Run', where Nazim will run his 12th annual Ramadan 10K in Bradford - all while fasting for nearly 16-hours

This incredible feat will take place on Sunday, 23rd March in his home city - Bradford - UK's City of Culture 2025, with the iconic Lister Park serving as the finish line.

For those unfamiliar with the gruelling challenge, imagine running 10 kilometers under the intense discipline of fasting - without food or water. To many, it sounds impossible, but to Nazim, it's all part of his mission to help the most vulnerable communities across the world.

Known for his remarkable dedication, Nazim's run is not just a personal challenge, but a call to action. His mission this Ramadan? To raise £55,000 for Green Crescent Aid UK's Burundi New Homes Project, providing 25 safe, secure homes for vulnerable families in Burundi.

Each new two-room home, complete with a kitchen and bathroom, costs just £2,200. Through this project, Nazim aims to build 25 homes for families living in makeshift shelters, vulnerable to extreme weather conditions and disease.

Nazim's work extends far beyond the annual run. For over 27 years, he's spearheaded humanitarian initiatives, raising nearly £1 million for causes worldwide. From house transformations in Malawi to aid for refugees in Syria, Iraq, and Bangladesh, his impact is global.

He's also a consistent presence in his local Bradford community, running the Khidma Community Kitchen and organising gift drives for children in hospitals.

In recognition of his tireless service, Nazim was named in the King's New Year Honours 2025 to receive a British Empire Medal (BEM). Yet, his focus remains on the people he serves, driven by a deep commitment to improving lives.

Despite a busy career as a Careers Adviser at three inner-city schools, and self-funded charity work, Nazim remains steadfast in his mission. "It's because of you that I'm able to do this," he says, expressing gratitude to his supporters.

Jordan pre-Ramadan deployment

Working alongside Hayaat Welfare Trust, Ali and his team delivered vital aid to Palestinian and Syrian refugees living in four remote camps in the Jordan Valley.

The mission saw the distribution of 420 Ramadan food parcels, 420 hygiene packs, £12,000 in Zakat cash (split into 238 envelopes for widows, orphans, the elderly & disabled), essentials such as shoes and clothing, along with toys and sweet treats for children.

Community kitchen provides 8,500 meals in just one year

The Khidma Community Kitchen, run by the Nazim Ali Foundation, celebrated its 1st anniversary on 27th February 2025 at the Millan Centre, Manningham.

Over the past year, the initiative has served over 8,500 meals, averaging 160 meals per week, and engaged 69 volunteers, with 66% under 18.

The kitchen fills a crucial gap in food provision on Tuesday evenings

in Bradford, supporting people from diverse backgrounds affected by food poverty. The core volunteers have shown unwavering dedication, even during adverse weather and Eid celebrations.

The Khidma Community Kitchen runs every Tuesday (4:30–6 PM) at the Millan Centre, Bradford. Anyone in need of a meal is encouraged to attend

Charity travels to Jordan to support the youngest and most vulnerable

Bradford-based international humanitarian aid charity Human Relief Foundation, with support from the charity's generous donors has recently travelled to Amman, Jordan to oversee packing and delivery supplies to thousands of Palestinians requiring urgent aid in Gaza.

The charity's latest initiative has been focussing on the dire need for baby milk formula in Gaza, with 10,000 tins packed and ready for distribution by local partners.

The need for baby milk formula is most prescient in Gaza as blockades have led to shortages, resulting in widespread malnutrition amongst newly born children and infants.

In many cases, these shortages have

led to parents resorting to desperate measures to adequately feed their children, resorting to the use of alternatives, including diluted herbs or crushed biscuits, posing significant health risks

The situation is further compounded by the malnutrition of nursing mothers, unable to breastfeed their children effectively due to insufficient food and water.

Reports from health professionals in Gaza have reported an alarming increase in cases of severe acute malnutrition and dehydration among children under five.

With many hospitals overwhelmed and lacking the necessary resources to provide adequate care, the need for aid organisations to respond has never been greater.

In addition to the supply of baby milk formula, Human Relief Foundation is also ready to deliver food parcels to over 600 families in Gaza. Food parcels provided by Human Relief Foundation contains non-perishable essentials including rice, pasta, canned vegetables,

sugar, lentils, beans, pulses, tea, and dates.

Human Relief Foundation Deputy CEO, Kassim Tokan is calling for urgent action to provide life-saving aid: "The devastation we've witnessed in the media highlights the unimaginable choices parents are forced to make just to feed their children amidst the chaos.

Working alongside our UNRWA partner in Jordan, we remain committed to delivering as much emergency assistance as possible."

Mohammed Talhah, Human Relief

Foundation's Fundraising Coordinator for the North added: "Visiting Jordan and seeing the scale of our delivery project has been a genuine eye-opener.

"With the generosity of the people of West Yorkshire and the delivery of Human Relief Foundation, we can make a huge difference to thousands of children in Gaza, letting them and their families know that they are not alone."

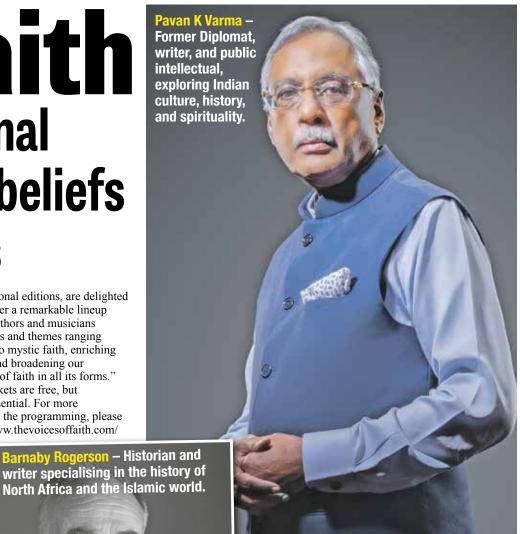

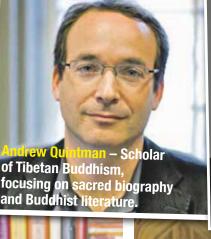

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Victim of Aldwych fatal collision named

The family of the woman who died in a fatal collision in Aldwych have paid tribute to her, calling her a 'beautiful soul.'

She has been named as 20-year-old Aalia Mahomed.

In a statement, her family said: "Aalia was a bright, kind and beautiful soul, who brought joy and laughter to everyone. She was a ray of sunshine in our lives, and will be deeply missed by all her family and friends. Her light will always live on in our memories and her smile will be our strength as we get through this difficult time."

Emergency services were called to a location close to The Strand, near Kings College London campus at 11:41hrs on Tuesday, 18 March following a collision involving a van and pedestrians.

Sadly, Aalia was pronounced dead at the scene. Her family continue to be supported by specialist officers and ask for privacy at this difficult time.

A 27-year-old woman was taken to hospital, where she remains in a serious condition. Her injuries are not believed to be life-threatening. A 23-year-old man was taken to hospital and has since been discharged.

Police arrested the driver of the van, a 26-yearold man at the scene on suspicion of causing death by careless driving. He was further arrested whilst in custody on suspicion of drug driving offences. He has since been bailed with conditions whilst enquiries continue.

Food running out in Gaza as Israel intensifies total siege during Ramadan

Food is now running out in Gaza as Israel steps up its policy of starving civilians during the holy month of Ramadan. For the past ten days, Israel has completely blocked the entry of food, fuel, medicine and other vital supplies for civilians.

It is now also shutting off electricity – yet another cruel act of collective punishment and a flagrant violation of international law - which will prevent people accessing clean drinking water, force hospitals to shut down and lead to outbreaks of disease. Many bakeries

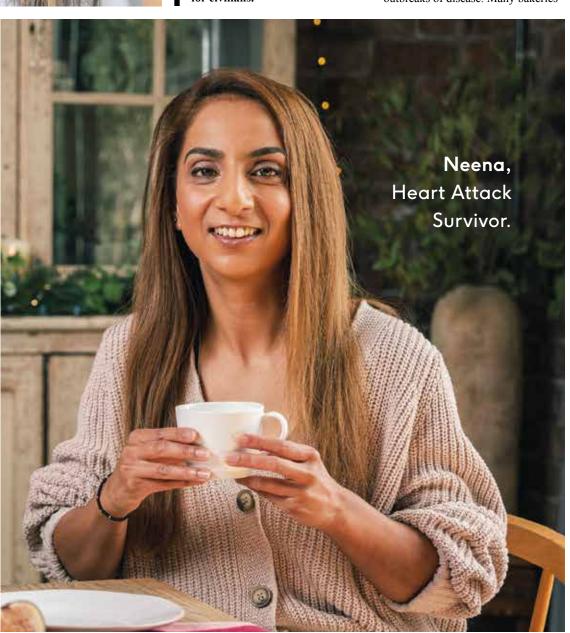

and community kitchens have already been forced to close as they have run out of fuel and supplies.

Deliberately depriving civilians of food, water, and medical care is a war crime and can never be morally or legally justifiable. The UK government must take decisive action to hold Israel accountable for its ongoing and systematic breaches of international law, including ending all arms sales, or risk being complicit in these crimes.

It is inevitable that children and some of the most vulnerable people in Gaza will die, unless international governments exert serious pressure on Israel to allow supplies in. Words of concern are not enough, immediate action is necessary to stop people from starving.

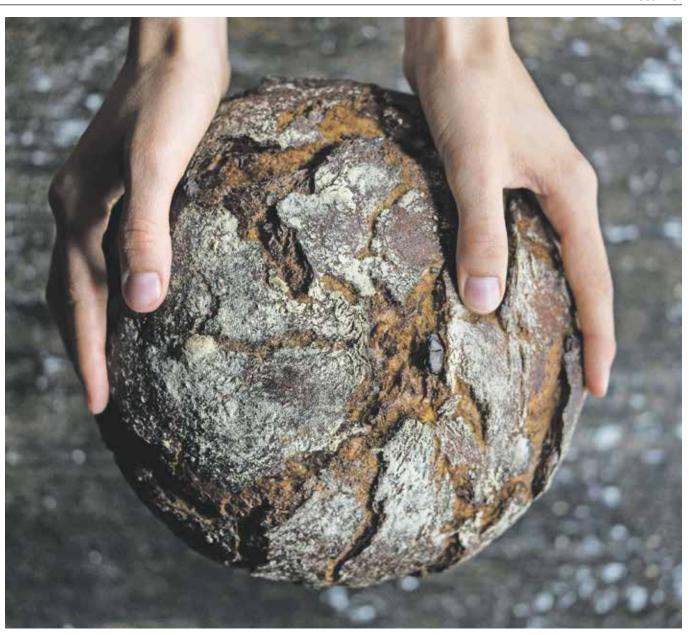
One Islamic Relief aid worker in Gaza, whose name is withheld for their safety due to attacks on humanitarian workers, says: "Babies are going to starve as a result of this total siege. Nothing is allowed to enter and every day there is less available in the markets. There's now very little protein, meat is almost non-existent and now many vegetables are running out. A lot of bakeries have closed over the past couple of days because they don't have fuel or flour, so it's almost impossible to get bread.

"It's Ramadan but it doesn't feel like it. It's normally a time for celebration and spirituality, but everyone is grieving and now everyone is terrified of what's going to happen in the coming days. We fear there will soon be a return to the famine conditions and starvation that we saw before the ceasefire."

Islamic Relief and local partners are continuing to distribute hot meals, water and hygiene items for displaced families – using whatever supplies we can find in local markets – but every day it is getting harder to source essential and stocks are rapidly running out. Aid trucks loaded with food and other essential aid are ready and waiting to enter Gaza but are being blocked just a few miles from desperate civilians.

Gaza's entire infrastructure has been systematically destroyed by Israeli attacks, including its ability to feed itself. More than 80% of Gaza's agricultural land and more than two thirds of its agricultural wells have been damaged or destroyed, and most cattle have been killed. Families in Gaza are now almost entirely dependent on imported supplies – supplies that are being deliberately withheld by Israel.

The scarcity has caused prices in local markets to skyrocket, making even the most basic necessities unaffordable for the poorest and most vulnerable. The UK cannot continue to stand by while starvation is used as a weapon of war – urgent action is needed now to prevent an even greater humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza.





Tell Mama faces closure after Government pulls funding

Tell Mama, UK's leading non-governmental agency, which supports victims of Islamophobia, and which meticulously monitors and records cases across the country is at risk of closing after the government withdrew its funding.

The decision comes weeks after the service reported a record number of anti-Muslim hate incidents in the UK. Over 10,000 British Muslims report incidents into it just in the last two years - from 2023-2024.

Since its establishment in 2011, Tell Mama has been funded by the Ministry of Housing, Communities, and Local Government (MHCLG), and has assisted over 50,000 British Muslims. The agency has been crucial in supporting victims of Islamophobia.

Tell Mama's funding for 2024/2025 was agreed by the previous Conservative Government and amounted to £1m. This was agreed to be paid by this Labour administration, but the Government has made no payment of the grant since April 2024.

This means that Tell MAMA has received no funding for 12 months, thereby weakening the sustainability of the national project and adding unnecessary and undue pressures on the work.

The Government has informed Tell Mama that it will no longer receive any funding, without offering details on any alternative provisions.

Police sources have expressed concerns, noting that Tell Mama's data-sharing agreement has been instrumental in monitoring rising tensions and

responding to threats

The funding cut comes at a time when incidents of religious hate crimes are at an all-time high in England and Wales, with Muslims being the most targeted group. The Israel-Gaza conflict is believed to have contributed to the rise in these incidents.

Several far-right plots have also targeted Muslims, including a neo-Nazi terror cell planning attacks on mosques and synagogues.

Fiyaz Mughal, founder of Tell Mama, criticised the government for cutting resources while the far-right grows across Europe. He warned that the move would leave vulnerable victims without support.

Mughal emphasised that Tell Mama is the only organisation currently offering nationwide support for victims and working with police to tackle Islamophobia.

He compared the organisation's work to the Community Security Trust's efforts to protect Jewish communities, but unlike the CST, Tell Mama's funding is

now at risk.

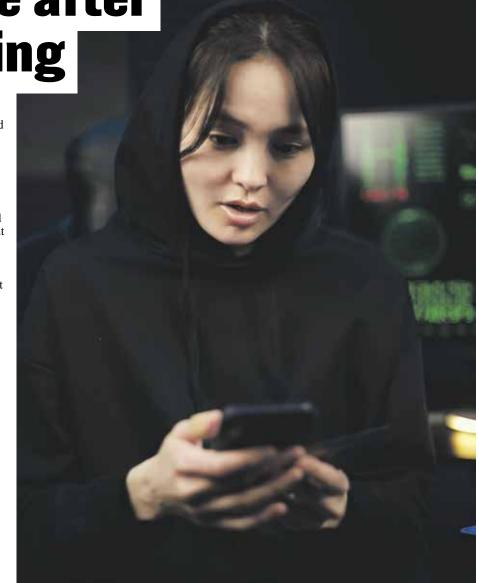

Despite the government's announcement of a new working group on anti-Muslim hatred, Mughal accused them of inconsistency, noting the disconnect between their stated goals and actions. The National Police Chiefs' Council highlighted the importance of third-party reporting organisations like Tell Mama in addressing underreporting of hate crimes and providing vital community insights.

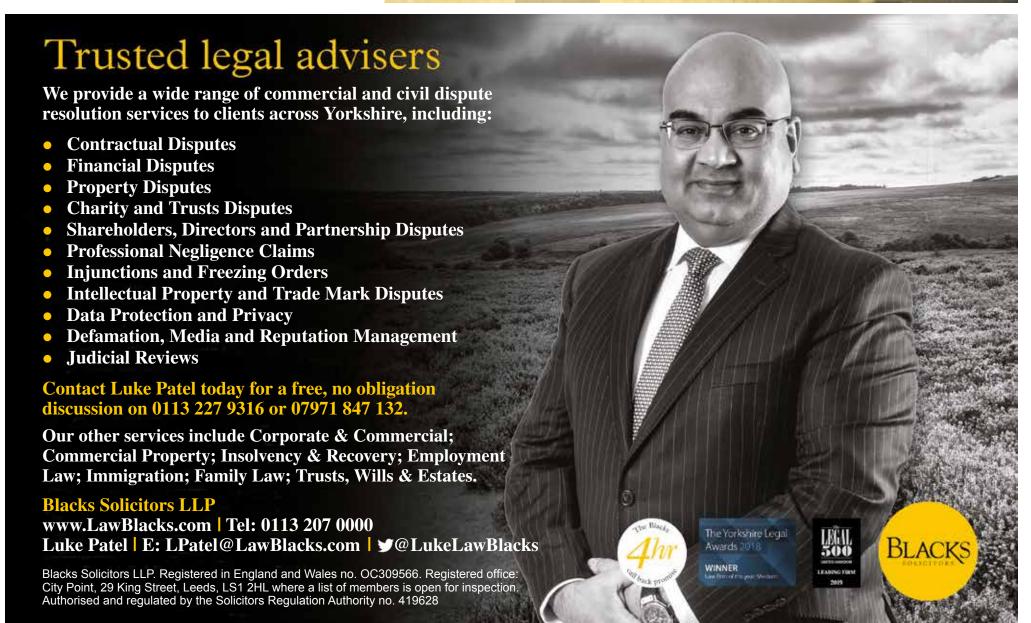

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Oncologist with incurable cancer on smarter, kinder treatments

One of the UK's most senior radiotherapy experts has spoken publicly for the first time about living with incurable cancer.

Professor Adrian Crellin was diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2016, and devastatingly, scans showed the cancer had spread to his bones.

Professor Crellin, who was awarded a CBE for services to radiotherapy in 2019, is a Consultant Clinical Oncologist at the University of Leeds and Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust, and holds a senior role with NHS England and previously in Cancer Research UK.

He says people like him are living much longer thanks to research advances – and he now wants to start a conversation about the way we describe life with incurable cancer.

"My cancer cannot be cured, but it isn't 'terminal' because it still responds to treatment," he said. "The proof of the pudding – I am still here."

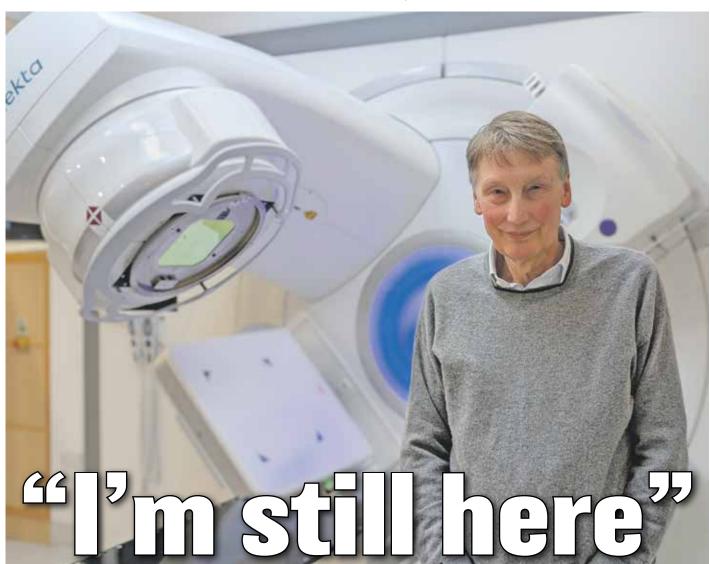
Crellin, a Consultant Clinical Oncologist at Leeds Teaching Hospitals and NHS England, has undergone chemotherapy, radiotherapy, and hormone therapy, keeping his disease under control. He emphasises that innovations like stereotactic radiotherapy, which delivers high-dose radiation with precision, are changing lives.

"Stereotactic radiotherapy doesn't just ease pain - it controls the disease," he explained. "After treatment, my scans and tests have gone back to normal."

A UK-wide trial confirmed that treating prostate cancer with targeted radiotherapy improves survival and quality of life. Crellin, awarded a CBE in 2019, played a key role in developing the Bexley Wing at St James's Hospital, where he now receives care. "Receiving treatment in a place I helped create is very emotional, but also reassuring. My colleagues are fantastic."

Leeds' Cancer Research UK Radiation Research Centre, recently awarded £2.94m for further research, aims to develop "smarter, kinder" radiotherapy. "The best way forward is through clinical trials and research," Crellin said.

He also calls for a shift in language around cancer. "'Terminal' and 'incurable' mean different things. Many people live longer with controlled cancer—so we must focus on quality of life and reducing side effects."

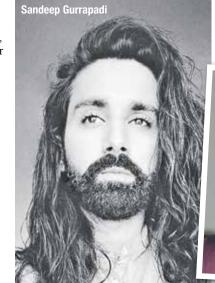

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Four jailed over UK's largest money-laundering plot

Criminals who laundered hundreds Leeds Crown Court. of millions of pounds of criminal cash through a West Yorkshire scrap jewellery business have been found

In what is believed to be the largest money laundering case ever in the UK four people were today found guilty of their part in channelling £266 million through Bradford-based company Fowler Oldfield.

Gregory Frankel, 47, Daniel Rawson, 47, Haroon "Harry" Rashid, 54, and Arjun Babber, 32, were found guilty of money laundering following a trial at

The case, led by West Yorkshire Police's Economic Crime Unit, uncovered a sophisticated operation that used Bradford-based Fowler Oldfield as a front to clean vast amounts of illicit money from criminal networks across the UK.

The police investigation found that cash was delivered to Fowler Oldfield in bulk, with couriers arriving daily from cities such as Glasgow, Manchester, and Merseyside carrying heavy bags filled with banknotes.

At its peak, the business was

receiving an average of £1.7 million per day, concealed in sports bags, carrier bags, toy boxes, and even takeaway containers.

The cash was counted using professional money-counting machines and deposited into banks by legitimate cash-in-transit companies before being used to buy gold grain, which is untraceable and easier to conceal than bullion. Much of this gold is then believed to have been taken out of the

The scale of the operation triggered suspicion in 2016 when a cash-in-transit company flagged the massive increase in cash deposits at Fowler Oldfield.

At times the amount of cash being banked by the company in one day was said to be similar to sums banked by a Premier League football club following a big match.

Investigators then conducted a meticulous review of financial records, emails, and 8,000 hours of CCTV footage, ultimately revealing that over £266 million had been laundered through the company between 2014 and

When officers executed a search

warrant at Fowler Oldfield's Bradford premises in September 2016, over £2.1million was seized.

No-one has ever come forward to claim any of the cash belongs to them. All four were found guilty of money

laundering offences at Leeds Crown Court last week: Gregory Frankel, 47, from Shipley, was sentenced to 11 years, eight months; Daniel Rawson, 47, from Scarcroft in Leeds, was sentenced to 10 years, ten months: Haroon Rashid. 54, from Bradford, was sentenced to 10 years; Arjun Babber, 32, from London, was sentenced to 11 years.

"Mind the GAP"

eople who have been to London are likely to have seen or heard of the phrase "mind the gap". The phrase is synonymous with the London Underground as it is the warning which has been used by Transport for London (TfL), who operate the Underground, for over 50 years to warn passengers about the gap between the platform and the underground trains. What is less well known is that TfL owns a number of registered trade marks for that phrase which it has used to sell branded merchandise with the phrase.

In 2021, TfL applied to trade mark the phrase to include goods not covered by its existing trade marks; these included eyewear, luggage and wallets. However, this application was opposed by the American clothing giant, GAP Inc, on the following grounds:

Bad Faith – GAP argued that TfL's application breached a Settlement Agreement which had been entered into between the two parties in 2004 which prohibited TfL from registering "MIND THE GAP" for certain



a trade mark to goods that were specifically covered by that agreement.

Likelihood of Confusion – GAP claimed that if TfL was allowed to register the trade mark then there would be the likelihood of confusion between TfL's trade mark and GAP's earlier trade marks in the minds of the average consumer. However, although the UKIPO found that the marks were visually and aurally similar, there was no significant conceptual similarity and therefore there was unlikely to be any confusion.

Reputation and Unfair Advantage – GAP argued that TFL's use of "MIND THE GAP" would exploit the reputation of its brand, which had a strong standing in the UK for clothing and accessories. However, the UKIPO found no evidence that consumers would make the link between the two marks, particularly given the distinctive meaning of "MIND THE GAP" being used by TfL as a public safety message.

Passing Off – GAP claimed goodwill in the "GAP" name and alleged that TfL's use of "MIND THE GAP" would mislead the public. The UKIPO dismissed this claim, finding no evidence of misrepresentation or likelihood of consumer confusion.

The UKIPO's decision was a partial victory for both parties. TfL was allowed to trade mark "MIND THE GAP" for most items that it had applied for but the UKIPO rejected its application for items covered by the 2004 Settlement Agreement, such as wallets, purses and cardholders.

This case highlights the complexity of trade mark disputes where historical agreements and widely recognised phrases are

involved. Although TfL was, to a large degree, successful the finding against it for acting in bad faith highlights the importance of respecting contractual

Amazon boycott could spread to the UK, costing up to £47m in lost sales

Amazon is one of a number of retailers being shunned by consumers over its association with the Trump administration.

Earlier this March, 9% of US Amazon users planned to boycott it. A similar move by UK consumers could cost Amazon up to £47m in lost sales, says the international delivery expert Parcelhero.

American shoppers are increasingly using their wallets to protest against political developments. A quarter of US shoppers have abandoned their favourite stores due to their political stances, according to a recent Guardian-Harris poll, while four in ten Americans have reportedly shifted their recent spending to reflect their social views.

One of the retailers now in the crosshairs of some US consumers is the online giant Amazon. Jeff Bezos, the founder of Amazon, gave President Trump's inaugural committee \$1m, securing a prominent seat at his inauguration.

Additionally, in the countdown to Trump's Presidency last December, Amazon told staff it was 'winding down outdated programs and materials' related to representation and inclusion. It became one of a number of US retailers to ditch their diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) policies – a move that has angered some US consumers.

Now the UK home delivery expert Parcelhero says there's growing awareness of the political implications of using certain retailers on this side of the Pond as well.

A recent More in Common poll found that 59% of Brits have a negative view of Trump and 24% have a positive one, while a growing number are joining campaigns such as the UK's Stop Trump Coalition to protest against his policies.

UK consumers may follow US shoppers' example and shun retailers who are perceived to be too closely aligned with President Trump's policies

Parcelhero's Head of Consumer Research, David Jinks M.I.L.T., says: "There's no doubt that some US consumers have stopped ordering from Amazon, as well as a number of other retailers, such as Walmart and Target.

"Last week saw an "economic blackout" of Amazon, according to a newly formed activist group called The Peoples Union USA. Its founder, John Schwarz, claimed people from across the world contacted him in support, asking how they could show solidarity.

"A survey by Numerator found that 9% of US Amazon shoppers intended to participate in the week-long action. If 9% of British shoppers were to follow that example, that would mean the online giant losing up to £47m, given that its most recently declared annual turnover (2023)

was around £27bn or £519m a week. That's assuming 9% of UK shoppers spend enough to represent 9% of Amazon's UK turnover. That may sound a lot, but it's small change in the context of Amazon's worldwide revenue of \$637.959bn (£490bn) last year.

"So, just how likely are UK and European shoppers to follow American consumers' example? Across Europe, boycotts of perceived Trump-supporting retailers and manufacturers are certainly taking place. Tesla sales fell 76% in Germany alone last month. That's likely to be because its controversial boss, Elon Musk, has taken a prominent role in President Trump's administration, including spearheading the cost-cutting Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE).

"However, while UK Tesla sales slumped 12.7% in January, they actually rose by 20.7% YOY in February – though largely because there's a planned car tax rise in April. Other luxury marques gained significantly higher increases as motorists rushed to purchase cars before the new tax takes effect.

"While Tesla might be escaping the worst here, UK anti-Trump sentiment does seem to be gathering pace. For example, UK Reddit users are increasingly vocal about cancelling their Amazon and X (formerly Twitter) accounts.

"That being said, even the boycott by US users has so far failed to make a notable dent in Amazon's figures. In fact, Amazon was quick to announce that its sales last week were actually up 5.6% despite the planned "blackout." However, there is another reason brewing why UK shoppers could ditch Amazon and other US brands

"Last week, the London Economic listed 50 US brands likely to be targeted by UK shoppers looking to take the "Canadian approach". That refers to the many Canadian consumers and retailers who are now boycotting US products such as whiskey following Trump's introduction of new tariffs on Canadian goods.

"The recent visit to the White House by UK PM Kier Starmer resulted in Trump declaring: "I think we could end up with a real trade deal... where the tariffs wouldn't be necessary." However, a US-UK trade deal is still far from certain. Trump could still impose new tariffs on British goods being exported to the US. Such a move would potentially encourage UK consumers to turn away from US retailers and products, following Canada's example.

"Of course, all this will have an impact on UK-US e-commerce and parcel deliveries. Whatever the outcome, we can expect some export and courier market volatility."

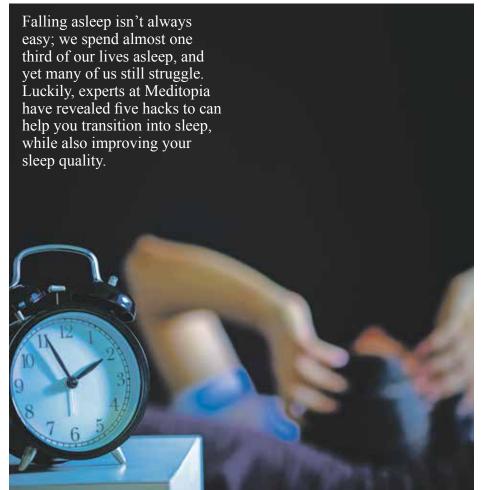

Many of us want to watch something on TV or spend some time scrolling through social media in the evening. However, research shows that devices that emit blue light aren't good for our eyes or our sleep.

A study found that individuals who use blue light filtering lenses compared to regular lenses two hours before sleep show fewer symptoms of insomnia and have better sleep quality.

In light of these findings, it's best for you not to look at your phone, computer, or television at least one hour before bed. Instead, you can try listening to the radio, or a podcast, or a sleep story.

There are lots of alternatives, but if you need to use screens, it's best to turn on the night screen mode in order to help filter the blue light.

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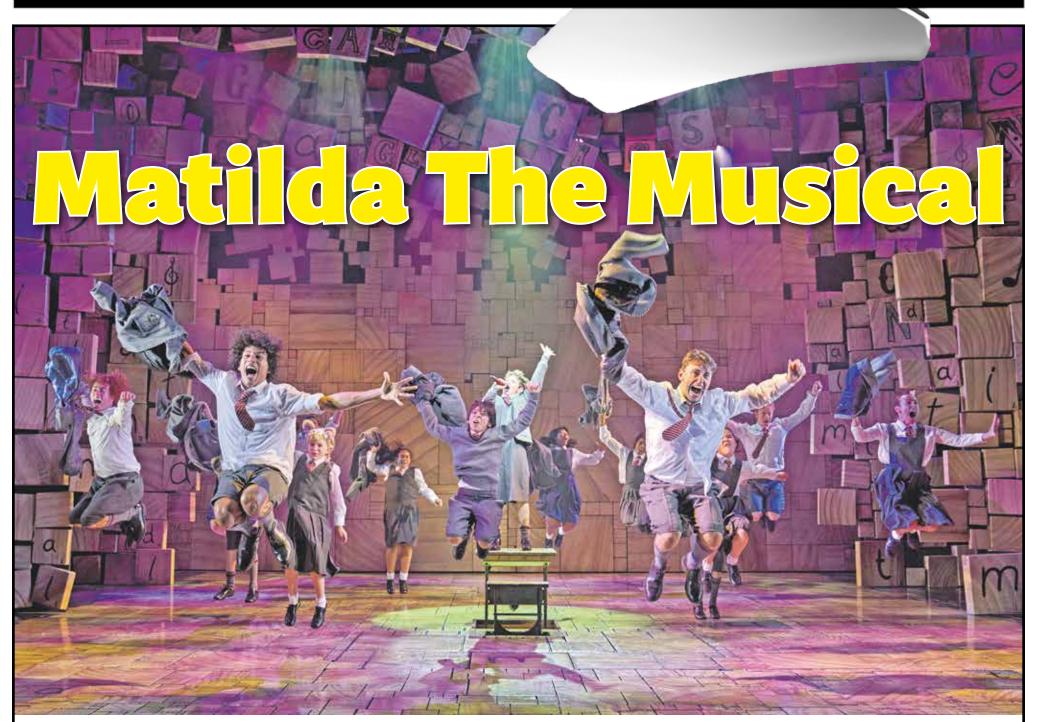

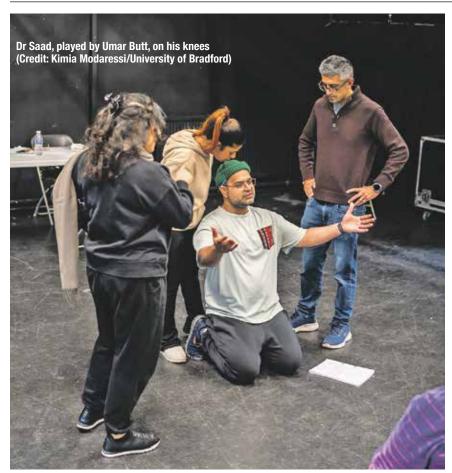

A Teaspoon of Shampoo

Fake doctor who prescribed bizarre remedies inspires play

The story of a man who falsely posed as a doctor for 30 years is the inspiration behind a new play produced by Theatre in the Mill, an arts organisation based on the University of Bradford campus.

Muhammed Saeed treated thousands of patients from the practice he ran in Darfield Street, Manningham, Bradford, but he was not medically qualified.

He prescribed one patient suffering from a cold with shampoo to be taken twice a day. Another was prescribed a substance similar to creosote [normally used to preserve timber] to treat toothache.

'Teaspoon of Shampoo', from Theatre in the Mill, based on the University of Bradford campus, is a dramatisation based on Mr Saeed's life.

Written by Dr Shabina Aslam, Artistic Director at Theatre in the Mill, the play, performed on campus from Wednesday 5 March to Saturday 8 March, follows the recording of a true-crime podcast inspired by this true story.

It features dramatic recollections of key moments in Mr Saeed's life, known as Dr Muhammed Saad in the play. At the end of the production, the audience is asked to decide if its main character was ultimately innocent or guilty.

Mr Saeed was finally exposed in 1990 and a subsequent police investigation discovered he had taken on the medical qualifications of a Pakistan-based doctor who shared the same name.

He was jailed for five years in 1992 after being convicted of four charges of obtaining pay by false pretences and property by deception. He died in 2003.

Dr Aslam, who grew up in Bradford, was told about the story by a family member in 2020 and then researched archive newspaper coverage of the 1992 trial, initially writing a short story based on the case before the new play.

Dr Aslam said: "I could not believe that

Dr Aslam said: "I could not believe that I had stumbled on such an amazing story. I spent hours researching it.

"I originally wrote it as a short story for myself, but I got it published as a 'zine and then I thought it was a really good opportunity to turn it into a piece of theatre. The play is a South Asian feminist perspective of the story.

"The play is inspired by true events. It is a dramatisation. It shows him in different ways including arrogant and falling apart. The audience is offered different views of one character. The play looks at the doctor as a fallible human being."

The production sees community collaborators from Manningham supported by practice-led research from the University of Leeds, including researcher, Dr Rob Eagle. The performances follow workshops with community and professional actors, which were held last year.

Theatre in the Mill is classed as a National Portfolio Organisation by Arts Council England, one of around 800 across the country. Its status means it is recognised as making a significant contribution to the local and national arts scene.

'Teaspoon of Shampoo' will be performed at Theatre in the Mill from Wednesday 5 March to Saturday 8 March, from 19:30 with a matinee performance from 14:30 on the final day.

McLaren's carbon fibre heritage and DNA

...from the revolutionary MP4/1 Formula 1 car to the new W1 ultimate supercar

in innovative technologies developed in Formula 1, McLaren is advantageously placed to deliver breakthrough automotive technologies that set the standards in lightweight supercar engineering.

And it is with carbon fibre that McLaren's innovative capabilities are strongly represented. Lightweight, strong, and rigid, McLaren is now approaching half a century as a world leader in this highly technical area of materials science and continues to push the boundaries of what is possible.

Carbon fibre plays an essential part in delivering supercars with the best possible combination of attributes on road and track. Every single McLaren production car since the first, the McLaren F1, has been based on a chassis made from this composite material.

It is a technology firmly rooted in McLaren's Formula 1 heritage, and is a core part of the McLaren DNA: MP4/1 (1981)

The MP4/1 revolutionised Formula 1 as the first race car to use a full carbon fibre monocoque chassis. Its lightweight, rigid structure significantly improved both safety and performance. Designed by John Barnard, this pioneering chassis led to widespread carbon fibre adoption in motorsport, changing F1 car design forever.

The introduction of carbon fibre chassis cars in the sport began a modernised era in Formula 1. The superiority of carbon fibre from a

in spectacular fashion at the 1981 Italian Grand Prix. McLaren driver John Watson sustained and walked away from a huge 140mph accident unharmed. It was a major moment in convincing the wider Formula 1 paddock that carbon fibre chassis technology was the future of safety in Formula 1. The performance potential of a carbon chassis was made clear only three races later, as Watson won that year's British Grand Prix by more than 40 seconds.

McLaren F1 (1993)

Pioneering the use of carbon fibre in road cars, the F1 boasted unmatched performance because of its light weight of only 1,140kg and its immense power of 627PS from its 6.1-litre V12 engine.

The carbon fibre monocoque engineered using at the time cuttingedge computer aided design and analysis - allowed the F1 to achieve a significant power-to-weight ratio previously unheard of in road cars, becoming an icon of supercar engineering.

It was the platform upon which not only the world's fastest road car was built, achieving a top speed of 240.1mph at the Ehra-Lessien proving ground in Germany, but it also embarked carbon fibre technology on a complete circle of track, to road, and back again, after the F1 GTR won the 1995 Le Mans 24 Hours.

McLaren 12C (2011)

The McLaren 12C, the first road car to be produced by McLaren

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Automotive at the state-of-the-art McLaren Production Centre, introduced the MonoCell; a single-piece carbon fibre tub that provided unprecedented stiffness and lightness in a road car at the time. The development of the chassis took the McLaren carbon fibre story into the 21st century.

MonoCell was the backbone of the world's first truly mass-produced full carbon fibre tub supercar range, delivering the benefits of this type of chassis construction on a scale never seen in the automotive industry before.

Its advantages over the Aluminium designs still popular at the time ranged not only from incredible light weight of only 75kg for the tub itself, but tortional rigidity so great that the Spider variant of the 12C required no additional chassis strengthening no compromise solution true of all McLaren spiders created to date.

McLaren P1™ (2013)

Only two years on from launching the 12C, McLaren would once again revolutionise carbon fibre supercar technology with the launch of the

McLaren P1™ in 2013. This second instalment in McLaren's '1' car linage took another step forward from its groundbreaking forebearer, the McLaren F1, through the use of a full carbon fibre body structure incorporating not only the roof and lower structures, roof snorkel, engine air intake cavity, but also the battery and power electronics housing that were integral to the P1'sTM high performance hybrid powertrain, in a structure known as MonoCage.

The entire structure weighed only 90kgs – a masterpiece in supercar engineering and packaging that proved to the world that electrification needn't mean compromises on overall vehicle weight and can play an integral role in delivering performance in a true lightweight Ultimate supercar.

McLaren 720S (2017)

The 720S introduced the Monocage II carbon fibre structure that is still employed by the McLaren 750S today, further enhancing rigidity and reducing weight compared to its predecessor, the MonoCell

The incredibly slim roof pillars of the Monocage II result in outstanding visibility through the windscreen, and combined with B-pillars that are positioned rearwards on the cabforward cockpit, the Monocage II contributes to a sensation of exceptional

The dramatic double-skinned dihedral doors hinge forwards and upwards as they open, taking a portion of roof in the process. The carbon cell had delivered a supercar as easy to get in and out of as easy is it was to extract maximum performance from

The McLaren Composites Technology Centre opens (2018)

The opening of the McLaren Composites Technology Centre (MCTC) in Sheffield, UK, in 2018 marked a £50m investment in the first standalone McLaren production facility outside Woking.
This world-class facility,

formed through a partnership between McLaren Automotive, the University of Sheffield's AMRC and Sheffield City Council, aims to be a

centre-of-excellence in both composites engineering and research, but also in production of new-generation carbon fibre tubs that can directly integrate with future powertrain technologies.

The first production carbon fibre parts to be manufactured at MCTC would be for the incredible, ultra-lightweight McLaren 765LT, the car's active rear wing, rear bumper and front floor designed, engineered and manufactured at the centre.

McLaren Artura (2021)

The McLaren Artura introduced the McLaren Carbon Lightweight Architecture (MCLA), designed specifically to integrate a new generation of high-performance hybrid powertrains. Lighter and stronger than previous chassis, the MCLA supports the Artura's hybrid V6 powertrain, while continuing to optimise and develop further the structural advantages of using a carbon fibre monocoque.

The MCLA marks a revolutionary moment in carbon fibre monocoque technology, enhancing not only the

lightweight and rigidity benefits previously developed into the MonoCell and MonoCage II structures, but incorporating a safety cell for the battery of the hybrid system used by the Artura and integrating further crash and load-bearing functionality into the tub.

McLaren W1 (2024)

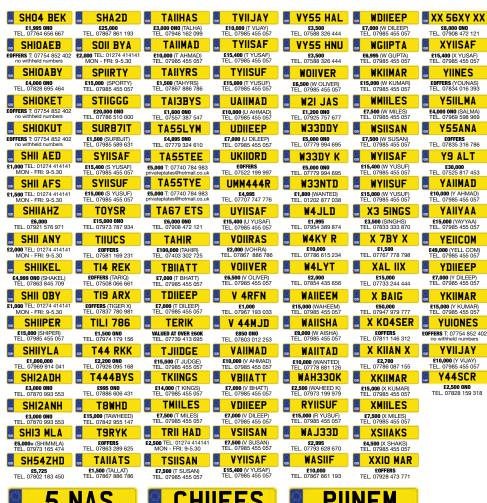
The McLaren W1 continues McLaren's lightweight carbon fibre DNA evolution with the arrival of the Aerocell, our most radical and technologically advanced carbon fibre tub ever designed for a road car.

Constructed using pre-preg carbon fibre, this technology – as used on the hyper exclusive, track-only Solus GT uses composite that is pre-impregnated with a resin system that simplifies the curing process. Pressure treatment is then applied in the mould, which gives the Aerocell higher structural strength than comparable tubs

Pound for pound, it results in a lighter tub that negates the need for additional bodywork in places on the car's exterior – a lightweight benefit explored in the design of the W1.

University all set to host Kabaddi World Cup fixtures

With the start of Kabaddi World Cup less than two weeks away, the University of Wolverhampton is all set to host fixtures as part of the tournament.

The West Midlands will be hosting the sport's leading global tournament, between 17 March – 23 March, with fixtures to take place at the University's Walsall Campus on 21 March.

The Campus will host women's group games, including England vs Hong Kong and India vs Egypt, as well as the men's quarter-finals.

The University of Wolverhampton is also the exclusive Higher Education partner for the Kabaddi World Cup.

This month's World Cup is the first time the competition will be hosted outside of Asia. The region will welcome the world's best Kabaddi players from men's and women's teams from across the five member continents of World Kabaddi, including Africa, Asia, Oceania, Pan America and Europe.

The contact sport sees teams broken down into raiders and blockers, with the aim of scoring points by entering opposition territory, tagging an opponent and making it back into their own half without being tackled to the

Looking ahead to the tournament, Professor Prashant Pillai, Pro Vice-Chancellor for Research and Knowledge Exchange at the University, said: "We're very much looking forward to welcoming colleagues from across the borough, country and from around the world to our Walsall Campus for the Kabaddi World Cup.

"The University were very specific in choosing to partner with World and British Kabaddi given the positive impact and opportunities that kabaddi can bring to communities, particularly around inclusion and creating a sense of belonging to our campus and cities, while also showcasing the power of sport on a national and international

"This is further evidenced through our School of Sport which produces impactful sports research which is recognised on a global scale.
