


The journey hasn't been without

### LEBANON: £10M Emergency Appeal

## Islamic Relief charity calls for an end to attacks on innocent civilians

Following Lebanon's deadliest day in decades, Islamic Relief has launched a £10 million emergency appeal to support people affected by the escalating Israeli attacks.

the escalating Israeli attacks.

More than 558 people, including over 50 children, have now been reported killed since yesterday, and more than 1,800 people wounded. Thousands of families are fleeing their homes in panic and are now seeking shelter in crowded schools, as more Israeli airstrikes tear through neighbourhoods today.

After almost a year of gradual escalation, more than 116,000 people in Lebanon have been displaced and are in desperate need of aid.

Islamic Relief's appeal is looking to raise an initial £10 million to expand their efforts to provide vital aid to displaced families

With Israeli attacks on Gaza also continuing unabated, Islamic Relief continues to call for an immediate ceasefire across the region, and for all parties to respect international law and protect civilians.

Akram Sadeq Ali, Islamic Relief's Country Director in Lebanon, says: "The past few days have seen the heaviest attacks on Lebanon in many years. The country has turned upside down and is in complete chaos, with more people fleeing their homes every hour and taking refuge in crowded schools

"Our team is delivering mattresses and blankets to new arrivals at some of the schools, and we will be providing displaced families with food and medical supplies for clinics. We're exhausting all efforts to deliver aid to those affected by this crisis."

Despite suffering with arthritis in both knees, PC Mistry is an active volunteer with numerous initiatives across West Yorkshire, helping the homeless and vulnerable with food and clothing.

The trustee of the Bradford Hindu Council and the current Temp Chair of the WY Hindu Police Association, he's also a member of the National Police Chiefs' Council Race and Religion Team and part of the Leeds Council Strategic Faith Leaders Board.

More recently, he's organised and implemented the Leeds Faith Trail, which takes colleagues and members of the community to experience different faith establishments - visiting a Mosque, Hindu Temple, a Church, Gurdwara and a Synagogue.

PC Mistry, said: "My passion of bringing awareness of my Hindu faith and its community to mine and other organisations, and to other faith communities has been at the forefront of my work.

### Man jailed after £5.7m worth of cocaine found in his vehicle

A man whose car was found to be laden with more than 100 packages of Class A drugs has been jailed for 10 years.

Garry Sinclair, 37, was sentenced on Tuesday (24 September) at Bradford Crown Court after he pleaded guilty to possessing Class A drugs with intent

Sinclair was driving a Volkswagen Passat along Valley Road in Shipley on 5 October last year when officers carried out a stop on his vehicle.

Sinclair, of Cliffe Lane in Gomersal, used his vehicle to ram two police cars as he attempted to flee, causing damage to the cars in the process, but was brought to a stop soon after and arrested for dangerous driving and criminal damage.
A search of the vehicle led to 111

packages being located inside.

These were found to contain a total of 57 kilos of cocaine, with an estimated street value of £5.7m. Sinclair was further arrested for possession of Class A drugs with intent to supply.

Sinclair refused to comment when quizzed by officers about how he came to be in possession of the drugs and was promptly charged with offences relating to the drugs and his driving. He was remanded to appear before magistrates in Bradford on 7 October, where he pleaded guilty to all charges

Detective Sergeant James Gross, of Programme Precision, said: "This was a significant seizure of Class A drugs which would have no doubt ended up on the streets of West Yorkshire had they not been intercepted.


Sinclair drove dangerously in an attempt to escape the officers who had stopped him, but they successfully detained him without serious injury I would like to thank them for their efforts and their bravery in bringing this man to justice.

"Programme Precision works closely with partners to tackle organised crime in West Yorkshire and anyone with information about those suspected of being involved in the supply of drugs or weapons is urged to pass this to our officers by calling 101, or by using the livechat facility on the West Yorkshire Police website.

### From Birmingham to Bradford

### Midlands-based street artist Mohammed Ali 'Aerosol' creates 32-foot mural for Yorkshire



If you drive into Manningham Lane, you're in for a BIG surprise!

'Neon Intermission' a 32-foot mural commissioned by Bradford community arts and culture organisation 'The Leap', and created by Birmingham-based street artist Mohammed Ali 'Aerosol', is greeting motorists and pedestrians passing the historic Connaught Rooms

The street art depicts a young Muslim woman taking an intermission to read whilst she leans against her car, with a part of Bradford's cityscape reflected in a wing mirror.

The mural, along with several other pieces of public art, is part of The Leap's Fuelling Futures campaign, a partnership with Mission 44, Bradford College and Bradford Council, alongside a wide range of businesses in the motor industry.

The huge dreamscape style artwork, which the artists said was partly inspired stylistically by the Blade Runner films, is thought to be the largest piece of outdoor art in Bradford.

Mr Ali spent a year creating it in his Birmingham studio in several different pieces, which have now been installed with the help of a crane.

For the artist himself, it's all about empowering and inspiring young people to dream big. He said: "My desire was to paint some messages that are about uplifting young people and the next generation, and trying to equip them with skills and the ability to alter their futures, their trajectory'

He added: "A lot of my work is around social justice and values that are about trying to uplift communities and bring people together. So the concept inspired me - using the arts on this big, bold scale on a giant building which you can't miss and you can see from afar.

"I've got a long history in Bradford, I love the city.

"For me, this is like my gift to plant into the Bradford landscape as a big bold mural that speaks to the everyday people in a very accessible way.

"For me, taking art to everyday people is really one of my missions, and the organisations I'm aligned with, I think we're totally on that same page.

"There's no better medium really of taking art into the everyday more than street art. It is such an amazing way of letting art spill out onto the streets and reach people that it wouldn't reach in a fancy gallery."

Mr Ali also hopes the mural will fuel further interest in people creating street art, and help it play a part in Bradford's upcoming year as UK City of Culture.

"Taking art into the streets like this at this important time, where the nation will be seeing what's coming out of Bradford, I think it's really timely and important to have," he said.

Mr Ali was invited by Bradford community arts organisation The Leap to paint the mural as part of its Fuelling Futures campaign in partnership with Mission 44, which is Sir Lewis Hamilton's charity. Its aim is to harness Bradford's well known car culture to raise aspirations.

Sabir Musaji from The Leap said: "A

piece of art like this can really make a difference and that's what we're about.

"This is now going to be one of three new cultural landmarks from The Leap.

'We've done the Living Wall on Leeds Road, we are also working towards an eco-park, and this.

"When people give directions, people are going to be referring to this as a landmark like 'take a left at the mural'. We've been very lucky to work with some amazing partners including Mohammed Ali."

The mural took a team of three people three days to install in its component parts, which included 16 separate wooden panels built together.

The artwork was already causing a stir just minutes after the completion of the installation.

Drivers and pedestrians stopped to admire it and take photos.

Also popping along to see it unveiled was visual artist and spoken work poet Asma Elbadawi, who is also a basketball player known for successfully campaigning to get a ban on hijabs for women partaking in the sport lifted.

She said she hoped the powerful image of a girl in a headscarf would inspire other girls and young people to follow their dreams.

"I think it's amazing. I'm dyslexic, I have my own way of communicating, mostly through art.

"Something like this, that has such a strong message that can be seen by people driving by and walking by, is pretty amazing.

"Having messages likes this like across different areas in Bradford, but especially here on such a busy road, is really good for people to see.

"It's powerful - it sends a message straight away to young people, and tells them to dream.'

# Statues across UK covered in baby slings in call for better paternity leave

A major new campaign has been launched by British dads calling on Keir Starmer to increase paternity leave for new fathers and co-parents.

The campaign is seeking to improve the UK's paternity leave offer, which at just two weeks each paid £184.03 is the worst in Europe.

Campaigners put baby slings on statues across London and Edinburgh, highlighting the role many sportsmen, artists, historical figures and members of the public play as fathers and how this is often forgotten.

This comes as a poll of 4,043 adults found 76% agree that "Fathers these days want to be a bigger part of their children's lives", rising to 90% among dads and 83% among Labour voters


With Labour committed to a review

of parental leave policies in their first year in office, The Dad Shift is inviting members of the public and major national figures to sign their letter to Keir Starmer, calling on him as a fellow father to get behind the campaign.



This year's KEF results (the fourth so far published) show the university is rated highly for continuous professional development, business start-ups, intellectual property and commercialisation. The results also said the university "generated excellent research across all disciplines."

The dangers of nitrous oxide use are being highlighted to young people in Bradford thanks to funding from the Mayor of West Yorkshire Tracy Brabin.

Hollings Youth Association (HYA), based in Manningham, has been delivering a series of workshops around the drug, commonly referred to as 'laughing gas'.

The project was made possible due to £6,500 funding from the Mayor's Safer Communities Fund, which takes money recovered from criminals and passes it on to community projects making their areas safer.

Alison Lowe, West Yorkshire's Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime, recently met with the project leaders to find out more.

She said: "The use of nitrous oxide can have a devastating impact so it's crucial that we educate our young people on the dangers.

"It was fantastic to visit the Hollings Youth Association and hear first-hand about the important work they are doing to highlight the serious and sometimes fatal consequences of nitrous oxide use.

"The Mayor's Safer Communities Fund is one of the many ways we are working with our community to help make West Yorkshire a safer place to live and work."

HYA decided to host the workshops on nitrous oxide use after the young people it works with raised it as a concern in their area.

The project has focused on educating people about the risks of nitrous oxide use, which can lead to suffocation or paralysis, and on the dangers of driving whilst under the influence of the Class C drug.

One workshop, organised in partnership with West Yorkshire Fire



& Rescue Service, saw young people experience a live demonstration of what it would be like to be cut out of a crashed car, reminding them of the potential consequences of drug driving.

Other workshops have been held in the nearby community centre and in the local mosque to help educate parents and guardians on what to watch out for.

A steering group of young volunteers was also set up to establish a peer support system and to help educate their friends about the harms of drugs.

"It was fantastic to visit the Hollings Youth Association and hear first-hand about the important work they are doing to highlight the serious and sometimes fatal consequences of nitrous oxide use."

Tausif Mohammed, manager at YHA, said: "Thanks to the Mayor's Safer Communities Fund, we have

been able to educate young people on the dangerous and often devastating consequences of using nitrous oxide. "The young people we work with really drove this project and they have been involved in all the activities and events, which we have tailored to different age groups, as well as getting the message out to parents.

"So many people reached out to get involved, such as Public Health Bradford, and we are pleased with how successful it has been so far working with partners and hope it will make a lasting difference."









### Thousands of illegal vapes and cigarettes seized

Thousands of illegal vapes and cigarettes have been seized in Birstall in the latest Kirklees operation to take money away from organised criminals.

Officers from the Batley and Spen Neighbourhood Poling Team and colleagues from West Yorkshire Trading Standards are continuing to investigate after raiding a shop in Birstall town centre this week.

In a joint operation on Monday September 23, officers and officials recovered between 2000 to 3000 cigarettes and vapes after executing a warrant at a shop.

Illegal vapes can often have higher nicotine content than normal licensed products with cash from sales providing a revenue stream for

The seizures were the latest of several such operations in Kirklees so far in 2024 aimed at withdrawing sources of potential revenue from organised criminality.

An operation in August resulted in police and trading standards seizing £17,000 of illegal cigarettes after raiding two shops in Dewsbury and one in Batley.

In joint operations the teams recovered 281 packets of 20 carton cigarettes from one shop as well as 62 packets of tobacco and 91 oversized

Two hundred and forty eight cartons of cigarettes and 27 fifty gramme pouches of hand rolling tobacco were seized from another premises while 250 packets of cigarettes were also found in a car.

Operations in May resulted in more than 26,000 illegal cigarettes being recovered following warrants at two convenience and food stores in Dewsbury.

Inspector Charlotte Nicholls of the Batley and Spen NPT, said: "It is proven that money raised from illegal vape and tobacco sales can be used to fund organised crime and these illegal products can also be more harmful to public health.

"The vapes can contain higher nicotine content and are not regulated or tested, making them potentially hazardous, especially to young people.

"For these reasons it is really important we act to restrict the sale of such products and take revenue streams away from those who create misery in our communities."

She added: "None of us want to see organised crime in our neighbourhoods and I encourage residents to keep contacting us with any information which can help us disrupt criminal activity and the sale of illegal goods.'



### BUSINESS YOUR LOCAL & BUSINESS ROUND-UP

n court proceedings the unsuccessful party will usually be ordered to pay the successful party's legal costs. The amount of those costs can either be agreed between the parties or, in the absence of agreement, they will be determined by the Court under a procedure known as **Detailed Assessment.** 

This is a separate court procedure that takes place after the main trial has concluded. Typically, unless the original trial was listed for not more than one day, although the Trial Judge will order that the unsuccessful to pay the successful party's costs, he would not usually assess the amount of those costs at the end of the trial. However, the successful party can ask for an interim payment on account of the costs pending the determination of the final amount, either by agreement or by Detailed

In the case of Patel and Others v Awan and Another, the High Court confirmed for the first time that an order for payment on account of costs could be enforced in the same way as any other money judgment or order. Prior to that

Assessment.

case it was thought that was not possible.

The case related to a claim for an order for sale in respect of a property. The matter proceeded to trial and the Claimants were successful. The Court ordered that the Defendants were jointly and severally liable to pay the Claimants' costs to be assessed if not agreed and that they should pay the sum of £118,800 on account to the Claimants by a specific date.

The Defendants argued that their liability to make an interim payment was a contingent liability on the basis that, until all of the costs in the claim had been assessed by the Court, the amount due could not be properly ascertained. Their argument was that only limited forms of enforcement would be available for interim orders.

The Court rejected these arguments and held that orders for an interim payment on account of costs could be enforced in the same way as any other money judgment or order as an order for payment on account of costs was a final judicial determination.

This decision will provide clarity on the enforceability of interim costs orders. Judgment creditors can swiftly enforce such orders to recover money due from defendants without having to wait for Detailed Assessment which can be a lengthy process. The case will also act as a warning to unsuccessful litigants that where an interim payment is ordered,

it is enforceable if unpaid



# Top aging concerns for women

How are women today approaching aging? According to a new survey, almost half of women express that aging causes them stress.

A survey of 2,000 women split evenly by generation revealed that Gen Z and millennials are more stressed about getting older than Gen X and baby boomers. In fact, both millennials and Gen Z lead the charge with feeling older than their age.

18% of Gen Z believe that they appear older, more than any other generation.

Still, more than three-quarters say they are trying to embrace aging with grace, and results reveal that over half of women are concerned others will notice signs of them aging.

Almost half of women noticed the first signs of aging skin by the age of 40.

Fine lines on their face (44%) and forehead wrinkles (32%) were two signs that women noticed most often, along with age spots (32%) and creases or lines in their neck (15%).

To help combat aging skin and avoid these signs from appearing, 70% of women surveyed take their skincare routines seriously, with most using between one and four different products on any given day.

Those products target the whole face, but when asked if they use products that target areas beyond the face or products that address specific concerns, such as the neck, eyes or arms, less than 40% of women confirmed they were using these types of skincare products.



In fact, only 17% of women say they pay significant attention to caring for their neck, with less than one-third of women using a skincare product on their neck on a daily basis

Further, only a third of women are confident they know how to properly care for their neck to prevent signs of aging. Almost three in five say they take steps to avoid behaviours or habits that are bad for their skin.

But still, women more so attribute aging to factors such as stress levels, bad habits - such as smoking or lack of sleep, or lack of using sunscreen.

Surprisingly, less than one in 10 blame technology and only 25% are aware of the concept of "tech neck."

'Tech neck' refers to wrinkles that can appear across the neck due to the position of the head and face when looking down at a laptop or phone for long periods of time.

Skin experts say that with technology playing an integral part in our everyday lives, it's important to modernise skincare routines and introduce products, such as a neck cream, to target the fine lines and wrinkles that can be caused by 'tech neck.'

The skin on our neck and decolletage area is very sensitive and will inevitably be the first to give away our age. Time spent on preventing these key signs of aging will help women to feel and look their age in the long-term.

# Has the *classic car market* reached the bottom?

In an ever-changing year for classic cars, Hagerty Price Guide UK Editor, John Mayhead, analyses the trends that suggest the market may have finally reached a plateau.

The last few years have been interesting times for the classic car market. After Covid came a surge in buyers looking for the car they've always promised themselves, and Hagerty's six UK indices, each of which tracks a different sector of the market, all showed a spike in values as demand outstripped supply and sellers pushed up asking prices. For a while, buyers were willing to pay them.

But just as memories of the

lockdown started to fade and the working-from-home revolution turned out, in many cases, to be a blip rather than a permanent change, so many potential classic car buyers came back down to earth with a bump.

Rising interest rates, a higher cost of living, and the uncertainty caused by pending governmental elections both in the UK and US encouraged people to be careful with their money. That, and some of those who had bought classic cars on impulse after the pandemic decided that they had scratched that itch and put their cars on the market.

So, in the summer of 2023, Hagerty watched as sale rates fell, both through dealers and at auction. Values followed, and in the year to 1st September 2024, 40 percent of models covered in the UK Hagerty Price Guide dropped in value, around 35 percent in the US Guide, both unprecedented falls. Combined sales results at the Monterey auctions in August 2024, the bellwether of the US market, were nine percent under Hagerty's most pessimistic pre-event forecast.

There's also data to suggest that sellers at UK auctions may be more willing to take less for their cars now compared with last year.

Analysis of the two Bonhams Goodwood Revival auctions, comparing 2023 results with 2024, shows that, compared with the mean low estimate figure, both the sale price and high bid (if the car failed to sell) dropped. That, combined with a 15 percent drop in the number of cars consigned and an 11 percent drop in the sell-through rate, year-on-year, could back up anecdotal evidence that people know it's the bottom of the market and both buyers and sellers are minded towards care.

But there are some signs that the market may have stabilised over the summer. In the last quarter to 1st September, nearly 90 percent of UK Hagerty Price Guide values remained static, with five of the six indices remaining within one

percentage point of neutral, well within the bounds of data error. The auction results we've seen at the end of the summer – Goodwood Revival included – may not fully reflect this yet due to the longer consignment process for live auctions.

There is a flurry of fall auctions in America, but now only a few notable sales in the UK and Europe until next year, specifically the Paris auctions in February. By then, a new president will be in the White House, Labour's fiscal plan for the next five years will be clear in the UK, and France's new government will have laid its cards on the table, all of which could enhance confidence in purchasing.


